What is the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire? The Triangle Waist Company was located one block east of Washington Square Park. There were over 500 employees – most were young women, most were recent immigrants. March 25, 1911 a fire broke out on the 8th floor. The workers ran to the fire escape. It collapsed, dropping them to their death. On the 9th floor a critical exit was locked. People on the street watched as the workers began to jump out the windows. Fire trucks arrived but their ladders only reached the 6th floor. The elevators ran as long as they could, workers pressed into the cars, and tumbling down the elevator shaft. 146 people died. The fire galvanized a movement for change, inspiring a sense of social responsibility and decisive action. In concert with organizations and individuals across the city, the coalition is creating a living memorial to honor those lost and the fight for social justice for all.
